NURSING PROGRAMS AT CLARK COLLEGE

- Registered Nurse (RN) Program - Students earn an Associate of Applied Science (AAS) Degree which qualifies the graduates to take the National Council Examination for licensure as an RN.
- Advanced Placement Nursing Program - For Licensed Practical Nurses (LPNs) who would like to earn an Associate Degree or for students currently or previously enrolled in a college nursing program.

RN PROGRAM MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS

- Completion of ENGLISH 101 or equivalent with a grade of 2.0 or higher.
- Completion of 17 credits of the following science courses or equivalents with a grade of 2.0 or higher: (Transfer credits from other institutions will be determined according to Clark College equivalency)

Biology 231.....4 credits	Biology 233.....4 credits	Biology 240.....5 credits
Biology 232.....4 credits	Chemistry 111...5 credits	Nutrition 103.....3 credits
- A minimum GPA of 2.5 in applicable courses. Applicable courses include courses listed above and any other previously completed courses that are listed as requirements for the Nursing AAS Degree.
- A minimum science GPA of 2.0.

RN PROGRAM ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

- Completion of a Nursing Assistant Course.
- Current level C CPR card.
- Accepted nursing students must successfully complete Biology 231, 232 and 233 with a grade of 2.0 or higher prior to entry into Fundamentals of Nursing (Nursing 101).
- Accepted students must pass an FBI Criminal History background check.
- Accepted students must have the entire series of 3 Hepatitis B Vaccines, Chicken Pox Vaccine (or titer), 2 MMR vaccines (or titer) and TB skin test.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT PROGRAM ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- Completion of a Nursing Assistant Course.
- Completion of the following courses with a grade of 2.0 or higher to be eligible for *first year* Nursing: courses: English 101, Chemistry 111, Biology 231, 232 & 233.
- Completion of the following courses to be eligible for *second year* Nursing courses: English 102, Psychology 211, Speech 201 or Speech 211, Biology 240 and Nutrition 103
- Completion of the following before *graduation*: Humanities and PE
- A minimum GPA of 2.5 in applicable courses. Applicable courses include prerequisites and any other previously completed courses that are listed as requirements for the Nursing AAS Degree.
- A minimum science GPA of 2.0 for Chemistry 111 and Biology 231, 232 & 233.
- Syllabi for all nursing courses transferred from other schools.

Students transferring from other colleges can refer to the *Clark College School of Nursing Transfer Guides for Prerequisite Courses* for information on course transferability.

Admission to Nursing School is competitive. Please check with the admissions office to discuss options.
