100% of LLSIL is the minimum figure for determining whether employment leads to self-sufficiency.

* For families larger than 8 persons, add \$3,820 for each additional person in the family.

† For families larger than 8 persons, add \$5,099 for each additional person in the family.

^ For families larger than 8 persons, add \$7,284 for each additional person in the family.
